# THEME: CAN I GET A WITNESS - THE GOSPEL TO THE ENDS OF THE EARTH THEME SCRIPTURE: ACTS 1:8

Lesson Topic: Paul's Boldness and the Reactions of His Audience Lesson Scripture: Acts 26:24-32

Purpose: This passage serves as an encouragement to remain steadfast in faith, to use personal testimony effectively, and to engage respectfully and rationally with skeptics.

#### I. BACKGROUND

- A. When: The events of Acts 26 occur around 59 A.D.
- **B.** Characters: Paul, Agrippa, Festus, Bernice, Jesus, Moses and the Prophets
- C. Places: Jerusalem, Damascus, Judea

#### II. INTRODUCTION: PAUL'S PERMISSION TO SPEAK (26:1–3)

- King Agrippa grants Paul permission to speak.
- Paul expresses gratitude for the opportunity.
- Acknowledges Agrippa's familiarity with Jewish customs and controversies.

#### III. PAUL'S EARLY LIFE AND PERSECUTION OF CHRISTIANS (26:4–11)

- Paul summarizes his upbringing as a Pharisee.
- Emphasizes his zeal for Jewish traditions.
  - ✓ Paul would have been very familiar with the *Old Testament Scriptures*, yet his biased reading of them led him to miss how they all *Pointed* to *Jesus*.

- Hope is a key word, appearing three times in vv. 6-7
- Describes his intense persecution of Christians:
  - ✓ He **Imprisoned** some
  - ✓ Voted for their Execution
  - ✓ Forcing them to blaspheme
  - ✓ **Pursuing** them even to foreign cities

	<b>Don't let mockery silence your testimony.</b> Trust in God's wisdom, not human approval.	
	Learn to Explain your faith clearly and lovingly (1 Peter 3:15). Reasonable, respectful defense of the gospel is powerful.	
	Tailor your witness to people's experiences – don't share a one-size-fits-all gospel. Paul used Agrippa's background to connect with him.	
	<b>Plant seeds, even if you don't see immediate fruit.</b> Skepticism is part of ministry. Conversion is God's work.	
	Pray for others with genuine love, even those who oppose you. Paul's concern was for souls, not his own comfort.	
	God can use setbacks to advance His greater plan in your life. Paul's detainment was unjust but providential.
