III. TAKE AWAYS

1. Jesus is trustworthy. Because He is God (verse 1), you can rely on His guidance when making hard decisions or facing uncertainty.
2. Build your life on what lasts. Verse 1 reminds us that Christ is eternal. Centering your priorities on Him gives stability when circumstances shift.
3. God understands what you're going through. Jesus became human (verse 14). He knows stress, fatigue, relationships, and pressure. You can bring everything to Him honestly.
4. Live with both grace and truth. Jesus modeled this balance (verse 14). We often lean one way or the other—these verses call us to blend patience with honesty in how we communicate and lead.
5. Look to Jesus to understand God's heart. If you ever wonder what God is really like, Jesus is the clearest picture (verse 18). His compassion, courage, and humility reveal God's character.
6. Your life can help others see God. Because Jesus makes the Father known (verse 18), we can reflect Him in workplaces, homes, and communities through integrity, kindness, and service.
